PARRAMATTA NSW 2150**MEDIA STATEMENT****Sex offender “Little Pebble” to be refused parole**

The State Parole Authority (SPA) has formed an intention to refuse parole to a self-described religious leader convicted of repeated sex offences against minors.

The Authority formed an intention to refuse parole to William Kamm, also known as “Little Pebble”, at a private meeting yesterday.

SPA found Kamm, whose offences occurred while in a position of authority, has so far failed to participate in a program to address his offending behaviour.

Kamm can now make application to the Authority for a review hearing to be held.

The 62-year-old will have served seven years, six months when his non-parole period expires on 13 April this year. His total 10-year sentence is due to expire in October 2015.

Kamm was convicted of five counts of sexual intercourse with a minor by a person in authority, four counts of aggravated indecent assault against a minor and one count of aggravated indecent assault.

The Probation and Parole Service recommended SPA refuse Kamm’s parole.

A Probation and Parole Service report said, “Given the nature of the inmate’s offences...it is considered beneficial that Mr Kamm undertake the treatment program in custody. Given that Mr Kamm...remains an untreated sex offender, his release to parole is not recommended.”
