PARRAMATTA NSW 2150**MEDIA STATEMENT****Michael Ibrahim banned from multiple LGAs**

A man convicted over a fatal stabbing in 2006 is banned from visiting multiple areas of Sydney including Kings Cross after being granted parole.

The State Parole Authority (SPA) granted parole to Michael Ibrahim at a public hearing today on the strict condition he will also be electronically monitored.

Ibrahim will be subject to 25 strict conditions including not associating with his co-offenders, Outlaw Motorcycle Gang members and his victim's family.

Ibrahim, 36, has served more than seven-and-a-half years of a maximum nine-year, four-month sentence for his role in the fatal stabbing at Chiswick in Sydney's inner west. His full sentence expires in January 2016.

As part of his strict parole conditions, Ibrahim must:

- Not visit or frequent six Local Government Areas including Auburn, Ku-ring-gai, Ryde, Waverley, Woollahra and the Kings Cross area.
- Not visit any Outlaw Motorcycle Gang premises
- Not associate with his co-offenders or Outlaw Motorcycle gang members
- Not associate with his brother Sam or sister Jazz Dior without prior approval
- Not contact his victim's family
- Not possess or use a firearm
- Abstain from drugs and alcohol and be subject to testing
- Be subject to psychological counselling

SPA granted Ibrahim parole due to his satisfactory prison performance and appropriate post release plans with available community intervention.

Ibrahim has also completed programs to address his offending behaviour including managing emotions and controlling anger.

Ibrahim will be released to parole no later than 29 August 2014.
