PARRAMATTA NSW 2150**MEDIA STATEMENT****Kalajzich subject to strict conditions on parole**

Convicted killer Andrew Kalajzich has been granted parole and will be subject to strict conditions for the next three years.

Kalajzich has served more than 25 years for the murder of his wife, Megan, in Fairlight in 1986.

The State Parole Authority today granted the 71-year-old parole after no submissions were received for their consideration before a scheduled public hearing.

Advice by the Serious Offenders Review Council found Kalajzich had demonstrated excellent progress in education programs, had maintained a strong employment history in gaol and had been described as a model inmate.

The Council also found it was appropriate that he be considered for release to parole.

As part of his parole, Kalajzich will be subject to strict conditions including:

- Psychological counselling if directed
- Not to possess firearms
- Non-association with particular persons
- Banned from overseas travel without prior permission
- Report to a parole supervisor as directed

The Probation and Parole Service also supported Kalajzich's release.

Kalajzich was found guilty of three charges including murder, conspiring to murder and attempting to discharge a loaded firearm with intent to murder.

In January 1986, Kalajzich's wife was shot dead by his co-offender as she lay in bed at their Fairlight home.

Kalajzich is due to be released next month.
