PARRAMATTA NSW 2150**MEDIA STATEMENT****Bulli rapist to be electronically monitored on parole**

The man dubbed the Bulli rapist, Terry John Williamson, has been granted parole but been banned from returning to the scenes of his crimes, on the State's south coast.

Williamson has served almost 22 years of a 24 year sentence after he was convicted of 19 charges relating to the sexual assault of 10 females between the ages of five and 43, and an 11-year-old boy, between August 1989 and May 1990.

Williamson has been refused parole for seven consecutive years, despite being eligible since 2004.

As part of his strict release conditions, Williamson:

- Must adhere to electronic monitoring
- Is banned from the State's Illawarra region
- Must undertake drug and alcohol testing
- Must continue psychological counselling
- Must comply with all directions regarding treatment and medication
- Cannot contact his victims
- Is banned from contacting children under 16 without supervision
- Must adhere to curfews

Consideration by the State Parole Authority of Williamson's release on parole was recommended by the Serious Offenders Review Council, headed by former Supreme Court Judge, the Hon. David Levine AO RFD QC.

The Serious Offenders Review Council report stated: **"Mr Williamson has continued to demonstrate his commitment to post release plans. In terms of...the positive aspect of his rehabilitation and capacity to reintegrate, Council remains of the opinion that it is appropriate for the offender to be considered for release on parole."**

In his sentencing remarks, Justice Loveday said: **"My reason for imposing the additional term of ten years...is to allow adequate time to integrate into the community under supervision after a lengthy period of imprisonment."**

Williamson is due to be released next month.
